## PAN CANCER INITIATIVE FEATURED AT ACCN INNOVATIONS SHOWCASE

The Pan Cancer Initiative was proud to participate in the Australian Comprehensive Cancer Network (ACCN) Innovations Showcase, held 2-3 July 2025, and hosted by Cancer Australia, Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre, and the VCCC Alliance.

The event spotlighted collaborative approaches to delivering comprehensive cancer care closer to home, with a strong focus on equity and inclusion. The Pan Cancer Initiative was represented through a poster display and speaker presentation, contributing to discussions on national data collection, benchmarking, and patient-centred innovation.

Key themes included co-designed initiatives to improve outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, showcasing good practice in networked care, and exploring opportunities to leverage the ACCN to strengthen cancer care implementation across Australia.
