WORK PACKAGE 1: FLINDERS REPORT FINALISED

We are pleased to share that the final report from Flinders University, led by Dr Imogen Ramsey, on the development of a national Core Outcome Set (COS) for cancer care has now been formally finalised.

This report represents a significant milestone for the Pan Cancer Initiative, providing the evidence-based foundation for what patient-reported outcomes and experiences should be consistently measured across Australia.

The work was undertaken using a rigorous, multi-phase methodology, including a targeted literature review and a three-round Delphi consensus process involving clinicians, researchers, policymakers, and people affected by cancer.

The outcome is a nationally agreed Core Outcome Set, comprising eight patient outcome domains and six patient experience domains, alongside a recommendation to include an open-text field to capture what matters most to patients in their own words. The report also includes an initial mapping of existing patient-reported measures to these domains, providing some practical guidance on how they can be measured in clinical care.

WORK PACKAGE 3: DISCOVERY PHASE RFP NOW OPEN

We are pleased to announce the launch of the Request for Proposals (RFP) for Work Package 3: Patient-Reported Data National Reporting and Visualisation.

This RFP seeks a qualified provider to undertake a discovery phase to assess the feasibility, readiness, and potential pathways for establishing a national capability to report and visualise patient-reported outcome and experience data across Australia.

This work will involve analysing the current landscape of patient-reported data, including how it is collected, managed, and used across jurisdictions to identify potential data flows nationally.

Submissions are due by 11.59pm on 26 June 2026.

WORK PACKAGE 2: ePRMS PLATFORM - UPDATED APPROACH

We would like to share an update on the approach for Work Package 2, reflecting a shift in how the ePRMs collection platform will be made available.

Rather than a centrally managed rollout, organisations will now be able to apply to access the platform's underlying code.

If approved, organisations will be able to create their own copy of the platform to adapt and use within their own environment. In practical terms, this means organisations can take a proven foundation and tailor it to their specific needs, systems, and workflows, while maintaining the core functionality required to collect patient-reported measures.

This approach provides greater flexibility for organisations to implement ePRMs in a way that best suits their context, while also supporting broader adoption across the sector.
